These discussion questions can be used the week following the message. You can use these questions for personal growth and development, or as a guide for your Connect Group discussions.

Getting Started

- Share something you've seen recently that has had a large impact in the world. Why do you think this impact was possible? Or, why were people so affected by it?
- When was the last time you shared Jesus with someone?

Listening Deeply

1. Are there any areas of your life where you have been "sitting on the sidelines"?
2. Why has it been so hard for you to break out of the habit of passiveness in this area?
3. What are a few ways for you to get past what's holding you back so that you can start following a new course on this issue?
4. Read Matthew 16:16. How does this verse give you encouragement?
5. What can the group do as a whole to help each other stay accountable to our call to share Jesus?
6. Read Matthew 28:18. Explain how this verse can give you the confidence you need to share the love of Jesus with the people you know.
7. How do you think you can have a bigger impact in your neighborhood, at work, or wherever you spend a good portion of your time? Also share some ideas of how the group could go out into the community to share the love and hope of Jesus.

Living Wide in Jesus

Remember, Jesus never took people into a classroom. He went out on the road and found broken people and offered them healing, and then he asked those people to go out and tell their story. Jesus didn't heal people who weren't sick. He didn't hang out with all the "religious" people. He went out and ate with those who were hated and looked down on. He went out and sat and ministered to the poor and needy. He gave hope to those who had none. If we want to become a church of over 5,000 growing disciples, we cannot stay in our comfort zones. We MUST follow in our father's footsteps. We MUST be like Jesus!

- Remember how very good (and strong) our Good News is.
- Live empathy; show compassion—remember the hell of living lost without Jesus.
- BE the living conversation of God—let Jesus send you to extend his offer of life!
